March 13, 2018

Janine Jones called the meeting to order at 3:45. **Attendance:** Janice McCord (for Scott Simpson), Kevin Oberlink, Cindy Rodriguez, Melissa Brown, Junie Lopez, Brian Holmes, and Curtis Carpenter. **Guest:** Mark Duffany.

Minutes Approval: A motion was made by Melissa Brown to approve the minutes and seconded by Curtis Carpenter.

SAC Funds: We have \$15,701.29 available in funds. Next month we will vote on Vertical planning funds for 25 teachers at a total cost of \$3,125 for 5 hours. During this time, we will align the curriculum for the 2018-2019 school years and create a calendar of events.

Principal's Report: The EBD unit will begin next Friday the 23rd. It will begin with 3 students and will be led by Heather Doney and supported with a co-teacher. We are setting the room up now. EBD families are being invited to stay the first half of the day next Friday. Although EBD families are not held to the Magnet rules, we are suggesting parents complete the volunteer hour requirement. We have 3 High Impact teachers at OMS, out of 51 in the district. They are acknowledged for the gains/ growth their students made in math last school year. Julie Rhue has completed her 5 year with this recognition, and Marianne Bartholomew and Jennifer Morrow have also earned this designation. Glow Dance was a success and was well attended. Thanks to Janine Jones spearheading the collection of data needed, we have been recognized as a School of Distinction. This focuses on our commitment to teaching to a diverse group of students as well as our focus on math and science. The state has approved 400 million dollars of funds to designate a resource officer at each school and \$.47 increase per student. We are waiting to see how this money filters down to our community and the impact it will have on our school. Security of our campus has been a huge priority. Already, we have put measures in place to improve our security, such as how we drop off children on campus. We are continuing to limit access to the campus with our pick-up procedures at walk up and aftercare. In addition, some rooms are being re- keyed to allow teachers to lock doors behind them. Tomorrow, we will have a district wide code red drill with teachers.

PTA Report: Fun Run is 3/23 and pep rally is tomorrow. K-2 will run from 1-2 and 3-5th grades will run from 2-3 on the 23rd. There will be a Mother's Day cake pre-sale flyer going home. Cakes will be sent home to decorate with students, once they are ordered. There is a Teacher Appreciation meeting on 3/21 at 9:00 for anyone who would like to help. PTA's nominating committee has been hard at work. We have retained most chairs and we have filled most open positions for next year. Finally, there is a parent who is spearheading a water dispensary initiative for our campus to encourage the use of refillable water bottles. There will be a stainless-steel water bottle sold by the PTA to raise money for this dispensary. They also have a couple of sponsors.
