II Principal's Report:

- Student Attendance Data- Mrs. Racine spoke about the attendance report and compared previous year attendance to the current year attendance.
 Overall, DTE attendance is 93.4% compared to 94.1% at this time last year.
 The goal for school wide attendance for DTE is 95% all grade levels: Pre K-Grade 5.
- Unify Grade Level Assessment- Ms. Vernette shared with the SAC members the data from District L follows:
 - o Grade 3: ELA $\underline{15\%}\rightarrow\underline{22\%}$; Math $\underline{36\%}\rightarrow\underline{65\%}$
 - **Grade 4**: ELA <u>61% → 71%</u>; Math <u>64% → 59%</u>
 - **Grade 5**: ELA $\underline{25\%}$ 15%; Math $\underline{69\%}$ 78%; Science $\underline{46\%}$ 53%
- Panorama Training- Ms. Vernette shared information on the new initiative of the School District:
 - o Measure student social emotional well-being; students rate certain questions.
 - Grit: If you fail to reach an important goal, how likely are you to try again?
 - Growth Mindset: How possible is it for you to change: Liking the subjects you are studying?
 - **Self-Efficacy:** How sure are you that you can learn all the topics taught in your class?
