SAC Agenda – February 20, 2019

Call to Order: Meeting called to order at 4:04 p.m. Attendees introduced themselves.

Minutes: Meeting minutes from January 2019 were reviewed and a motion to pass was made by Margaret Ingram and seconded by Julie Baker.

Discussion on Membership: Cliff Melvin will no longer be able to participate as a community member of the SAC committee at Beachland Elementary. He will be out due to personal reasons and will contact the school when he is able to return. Jamie Vega has a change in schedule and is now working and may no longer be able to participate. In light of these changes, we will need someone to chair the SAC meetings. Dr. Lord stated she would contact the no show members to determine if they are still interested in serving and possibly serving as SAC chair.

Safety Committee Report:

- A safety meeting was held today. Discussion on the need to make sure that maps are posted in all rooms. No wedges should be used to hold doors open. Evacuations were discussed, How to evacuate and check for barriers in different areas of the school. Currently, students evacuate to the hard court, however they are discussing what to do if students needed to cross the street. The school is practicing with students and teachers for various scenarios. Mrs. Baker asked about renovations to the front office. Dr. Lord stated that is most likely 2 years out. Beachland is currently considered a single point entry school. In regards to medical emergency, Mrs. Gabbard is point of start. The school does have a plan in place of an emergency. There is a certain number of trained CPR staff per student ratio. Mrs. Davis asked if they would consider the safety sleeves for the door hinge at top of door. Dr. Lord states she would look into cost, financial support and whether or not is assist in helping secure in the time of an emergency.

New Business:

- Mrs. Del Tufo discussed the after school program which will involve reading and will include 12-15 students, two days a week and math which will include 5-6 students, and will be one day a week. The after school program will start in a couple weeks. Discussion continued with students who don't respond to offer or participate, Mrs. Del Tufo contacts families if needed.
- **Enrichment** – Beachland has the highest number of gifted students in one school. Concern that one day is not meeting the needs of those students. The District asked if Beachland might be interested in providing a full time gifted program. This would be servicing students with a full time, gifted homeroom for enrichment. In order for this to be provided, teachers would need to be gifted certified. There are currently 3 teachers at Beachland Elementary who are gifted certified. This enrichment program would start this upcoming academic year 2019-2020 with 1st and 2nd grade, followed by 3rd and 4th and finally 5th graders in the year 2021-2022.

Currently, grade level chairs have been informed and have positive input as of now. Mrs. Ingram stated that she felt there is a need, for students who may not have been identified already to help in pushing them forward and especially those who are not getting the help/support they need at home. The discussion continued with the question of whether or not pulling gifted out of the classroom would affect the other students who may be struggling. Mrs. Davis reported that often it is the mid-average student that is more helpful than the gifted thinkers in assisting others learn. Often, gifted children are focused thinkers and not as helpful with other children. Mrs. Baker added that gifted can also be more out of the box thinkers, which makes it difficult for them to explain how they come up with answers, they just figure it out differently. Mrs. Davis asked if parents could opt out? Dr. Lord answered "yes".

Dr. Lord continued to say Gifted Grant funds may be available and that we would also need to look into additional financial resources for needs that go above and beyond what is available. The school will also be looking into curriculum that is available for this program. Overall, this program will allow for more project based learning, however with the same standards.

- **Guided reading** is being requested by Kindergarten, levels D/E. Cost is approximately \$640 (on sale now). Discussion on electronic vote to be sent out for vote to approve.

Julie Baker made a motion to adjourn meeting, Lorri Dior seconded the motion. Next SAC meeting will be held April 17th at 4 p.m. in the Media Center.

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
