Mrs. Miller shared the data comparing unit assessments comparing 2018-2019, 2019-2020, and 2020-2021 unit 1 and unit 2 ELA, math and science data. Mrs. Miller also shared the targets need in proficiency and learning gains for the 2020-2021 school year to project our schoolwide goals to get the points needed to be an A school. Mrs. Miller spoke about our re-entry plan and shared that our school was operating at 44% capacity for the first nine weeks and now we have transitioned into the second nine weeks at a capacity of 70% with our students returning back to school. Mrs. Miller shared the plan for A2 with the SAC members and this is a way we will acclimate and accelerate our student to close achievement gaps due to COVID 19 and ways we will catch up our students in ELA, Math, and science.
