Ms. Vernette spoke about the school data listed in the charts above. Ms. Vernette spoke about the Geer and Rising K tutoring program we ran from August 31-October 29, 2020. Students in grades K, 2, 3, 4,5 were tutored three days a week in person and 1 day a week on virtual for eight weeks. There were 96 students that participated in the program and 19 teachers who tutored the students. The program focused on science, literacy, and vocabulary skills and helped close the gaps for students at DTE.

Students in grades K-5 are getting ready to take the i-Ready winter diagnostic the week of December 7-December 18, 2020. We are focusing in our A2 plan which is to Acclimate & Accelerate our student by doing focus Friday, which is our school-wide early release schedule on Fridays and close gaps in literacy or enrich in grades K-2 and provide FSA practice for students in 3-5. This is a strategic plan to focus on student proficiency and learning gains school-wide.

Ms. Vernette shared a need for our SAC members to prepare for a upcoming request at the next SAC meeting for IXL a computer program to support all students in math, science, literacy and Mr. Gaulkin generously donated to support the need for technology to help assist our students to be successful at home or in school.
