A. Meeting called to order: @3:34pm

B. Action Items

1. Approval of minutes: Motion by Bonnie Kidder and Second by Alma Miller with unanimous vote
2. CTE Tours: noted type-o on agenda) Going on this week. CTE tours for our 9th graders will be during the day this Wednesday and Thursday February 17th and 18th. CTE parent night for our 9th graders will be in the PAC on Thursday 2/18/2021 @ 6pm and teachers for these programs will be on site. Mrs. Burr said that kids here that attend will get priority.
3. Incoming 9th grade Open House: Representative will be going to Storm Grove on 2/17 at 6pm to discuss and then to SRMS on 2/18 at 6pm rather than having this on our campus. Charter Jr. High, Imagine, and Gifford Middle School have been invited to attend these as well. The middle schools have been advertising for these events.
4. Incoming IB and Pre-IB/AP parent night presentations via Zoom and live meetings with Mr. Sturgeon. There were some hiccoughs with the Zoom process and only two parents attended. Mr. Valencia and Mr. Sturgeon will be speaking to those who missed. Current 10th graders were given information on how to apply and there were a lot of questions at both the pre-IB and IB sessions.
5. Registration for 21-22 school year begins in March. At SRMS counselors will go into classes at the school and the students will be given a two-part paper for students and parents requests to build schedules and to SGMS one time to get input. Some students that are seeing school choice for IB or CTE offered at SRHS will have to follow protocol and submit a written request. Class sizes will play a main deciding factor. Mr. Cummings expressed that the district will limit "choice" and some students will be placed on a wait list. He informed us that the superintendent Dr. Moore might try the idea of school choice. Right now, as long as the student provides their own transportation, they are considered but Dr. Moore is looking into a shuttle bus option like it is done with the IB program currently. Right now, the registration process for current 9-11th grade is being looked at to see which is better, paper vs. online. Online versions of the paper forms are being developed.

C. Sharing:

Discussion occurred from Alma Miller regarding IB and dual enrollment. Mr. Valencia explained the differences and the common reasons why students make the decisions for each.

Principal Cummings shared the campus projects update: Bathroom renovations are done. During the morning and lunch some are locked secondary to safety and the ability to monitor.

Exterior painting of the campus is coming. Painting of the stadium will be first with a start date sometime in April or May. Carpet to tile transition continues. The track is planned to be refurbished sometime in 23-24 school year. Next school year there is current dialogue regarding an 8th period schedule. This will allow for a 90-minute vs a 100-minute block schedule pattern. Right now, 7th is 2 50-minute blocks. With this proposed change students would attend four 90-minute blocks each day and lunches will decrease from 3 periods to 2. Class sizes will remain the same and teachers are expected to have the same number of students. Also, Principal Cummings was able to share that Dr. Moore has agreed to allowing both high schools to have a senior prom. This will not be a Jr-Sr prom, just seniors only with allowing each senior to have a plus one. We have secured an agreement with the IG center for May 1st. There will be a need to establish a prom committee and will be assisted by Mrs. Raddish. Parents and student volunteers will be needed. Lastly, there is talk about a senior grad bash and Dr. Moore has approved that as well and we are awaiting word from Universal Studios. If anyone knows of any business or individuals who wish to sponsor or donate to the prom committee keep this in mind.

Karen Rutledge shared the latest COVID-19 data from the FDOH website. Currently @ SRHS based on the data as of February 6, 2021, we have had 91 total reported cases. Of those cases, 94.5% are students, 1.1% are teachers and 4.4% are listed as Unknown Role and 0% are staff. Of those reported, 71.4% expressed symptoms. This data supports the published "School Report for Florida FAQ" listed on the FDOH website that under question number 14, the FDOH states "we have seen low secondary transmission rates in schools across the state; viral transmission seems to occur almost entirely outside of school campuses". Principal Cummings shared that district employees over the age of 65 will get the vaccines through the county health department. SDIRC secured vaccines and the first shot have been given to these individuals and the second doses have been scheduled.
