 - a. PBIS Resilience Award
 - i. Positive Behavior Intervention
 - ii. This comes from Riding the Wave of Success and goals implemented
 - iii. Some students according to the survey last year – didn’t have the sense of belonging here. Trying to improve this feeling throughout the year.
 - b. STEAM Silver Model School
 - i. 1st year all schools can participate
 - ii. 1 of 9 participated in pilot program
 - iii. Through Project Lead the Way
 1. 1st year introducing program
 2. Hands on, engaging program
 3. We did one module in each of the specials
 4. Due to staggering the student come back – one reason we did not receive GOLD
 - a. Not as smooth of a program as we would have liked

 - 2. This would strengthen the availability of substitutes

 - g. Must look at bottom quartile for Math and Reading
 - i. Theses students will get specific instruction in those areas
