GES EXTRACURRICULAR PROGRAMS

Safety Patrols (5th Grade):

School Safety Patrol members are school-sponsored student volunteers from upper elementary grades. Patrollers direct children, not traffic. As school-age leaders in traffic safety, patrol members teach other students about traffic safety on a peer-to-peer basis. They also serve as models for younger children, who look up to them. School Safety Patrol members:

- Complete training in traffic safety.
- Protect students from hazards of crossing roads and highways on their way to and from school.
- Assist bus drivers in safely transporting students to and from school.
- Teach fellow students about traffic safety.
- Serve in other leadership roles under the direction of school officials.

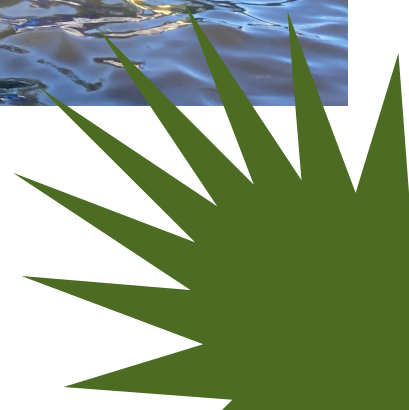
Typically, teachers and principals appoint patrol members, who participate with parental approval. A teacher usually serves as the patrol advisor.

Mighty Mu:

Mighty Mu is an annual math competition for middle and elementary schools. The entire competition is run by PHUHS Mu Alpha Theta members. Mighty Mu features divisions for 4th grade, 5th grade, 6th grade, Pre-Algebra, Algebra 1, and Geometry.

D.A.R.E. (5th grade):

D.A.R.E. (Drug Abuse Resistance Education), is a highly acclaimed program that gives kids the skills they need to avoid involvement in drugs, gangs, and violence.

D.A.R.E. is a police officer-led series of classroom lessons that teaches children from kindergarten through 12th grade how to resist peer pressure and live productive drug and violence-free lives.

D.A.R.E.'s elementary, middle and high school curricula, as well as its enhancement lessons focus on subjects that include bullying, internet safety, and over-the-counter prescription drug and opiates abuse.

Grandparent's Day:

At Glendale Elementary we believe that Grandparents play a vital role in building confidence, sharing wisdom/positive experiences, strengthening bridges between school and home thus enhancing student achievement. Each year we host a Grandparent's Day breakfast where students invite their grandparents or special family friends to have breakfast and visit their classrooms.

Glendale Student Council (4-5th grades):

Our Student Council is a group of elected and volunteer students working together with an adult advisor within the framework of a constitution or bylaws to provide a means for student expression and assistance in school affairs and activities, give opportunities for student experience in leadership and encourage student / faculty / community relations.
