

How can I help my child be successful with *i-Ready*?

- ◆ Encourage students to always do their best within the *i-Ready* program, on assessments and daily lessons.
- ◆ Let the students know that *i-Ready* is an important part of their learning and that what they learn on *i-Ready* will help them in all academic areas.
- ◆ Ask your student what he/she is learning about. Have them describe some of the lessons and questions to you.
- ◆ Ask your child's teacher for specific directions on how to log in to your student's account from home.
- ◆ Students and parents can view progress under the *My Progress* section within the student's dashboard.
- ◆ Ask your child's teacher about your student's progress on *i-Ready* during parent/teacher conferences.
- ◆ Make sure the student knows that their progress on *i-Ready* is important to YOU, so it will also become important to THEM!

What is *i-Ready*?

i-Ready is an online, interactive learning environment. The program is designed to assess students' current academic levels in reading and math and provide individualized lessons based on each student's unique needs.

The *i-Ready* experience provides feedback to students, parents, and teachers regarding the student's progress in each skill.

i-Ready Diagnostic Test Administered to Students 3 times per year (Fall, Winter, Spring)

Students begin Individualized online instruction

Teacher conducts ongoing data reviews and provides intervention, enrichment, and support

How is the *i-Ready Diagnostic Assessment* different from other tests?



The *i-Ready Diagnostic Assessment* is a computer **adaptive** test.

- Adaptive assessments use sophisticated technology to provide a customized evaluation of each student's ability.
- Computer adaptive tests match the difficulty of the test questions to the ability of each student. As questions are answered correctly, the questions become more difficult. As questions are answered incorrectly, the questions become easier. Students are NOT expected to know every answer.
- The diagnostic continues to provide questions until the assessment reaches the academic level that is perfectly matched to each student.

K-8 students will be given the diagnostic three times throughout the year in both reading and math to monitor growth over time and to update their online individualized learning path.

How does instruction with *iReady* work?

- After each diagnostic is completed, a series of online lessons based on a student's current academic level in both reading and math is developed.
- Lessons include a tutorial, guided practice, and a check for understanding. Lessons are designed to be fun and interactive!
- Teachers conduct ongoing data reviews and provide intervention, enrichment, and support.
